

## School Garden Network is hiring a Garden Camp Manager!

Job Title: Summer Camp Manager Reports to: SGN Executive Director

Classification: Seasonal, Part-time, Non exempt, Hourly

Compensation: \$30/hour

<u>School Garden Network (SGN)</u> seeks an energetic, creative, and fun individual to develop and lead a celebratory and inclusive <u>Garden Camp</u>. Camp takes place in a school garden and consists of 4 weeks full of activities that nurture a life-long appreciation of nature, build healthy habits, and create lasting friendships. The Garden Camp Manager is an essential member of SGN's staff and will work closely with SGN's Executive Director. This part-time position is multi-faceted and requires a diverse skill set and passion for garden-based learning.

## **Camp Manager Duties:**

- Program Development: Part-time and remote.
  - Develop and implement a plan for a diversity of daily summer camp activities for
    7-11 year olds that include group games, adventure scenarios, leadership skills,
    crafts, nature hikes, gardening, cooking, and other hands-on activities.
  - Create leadership opportunities for camp Junior Educators (12-17 yr olds).
  - o Review and revise camp handbook.
  - Interview and hire other camp instructors.
  - Plan and facilitate a 3-day teacher training for camp instructors in June 2024.
- Program Management: Full time and onsite.
  - Manage camp registration.
  - Supervise a small team of camp instructors.
  - Share and communicate teaching responsibilities and planning with co-instructors, and provide support to them.
  - Participate in all scheduled camp staff training sessions and camp events.
  - Maintain excellent rapport and constant communication with parents of camp participants on a daily basis.

- Communication:
  - o Maintain excellent communication with SGN Executive Director and staff.
  - Consult with the Garden Educator at camp host school and maintain excellent communication with their school garden staff.
  - Act as a professional representative of the School Garden Network.
  - Create content and take photos for SGN newsletters, website, and social media.

## **Requirements and Qualifications**

- Belief in the mission of School Garden Network, with demonstrated commitment to this work.
- Passion for food and environmental education, with a minimum of two years of experience leading outdoor education programs or summer camps for elementary and/or middle-school age children.
- Past experience in curricular development is essential.
- Capacity to work independently without direct supervision.
- Demonstrated ability to work collaboratively.
- Outstanding communication skills, both written and verbal, with ability to engage effectively with the public.
- Understanding of and ability to communicate the value of garden-based learning to diverse audiences.
- Demonstrated ability to supervise a diverse team through constructive feedback and non-violent communication.
- Flexibility and willingness to adapt to changing conditions.
- Capacity to handle bulky, heavy teaching equipment (up to 50 lbs).
- Proficient in leading field trips over diverse terrain in all weather conditions.
- Must possess a current driver's license and have reliable access to transportation.
- Current First Aid and CPR certifications a must, or willing to obtain.
- General computer literacy, including proficiency in Microsoft Office programs and Google Suite.
- Spanish language proficiency and cultural competency are a plus.
